Who We Are

CAPPED is the premier state association advocating for, and facilitating family access to, child care subsidies to providers of early care and education programs. Established in 1977, CAPPED is the lead voice for public and private non-profit agencies that contract with California Department of Education (CDE) to provide families with child care subsidies supporting children learning while parents are earning.

What are Alternative Payment Programs?

Alternative Payment Programs (APPs) provide child care and family support services to over 500,000 children and 281,000 families throughout California. APPs are located in each of California's 58 counties. APPs provide many services including:

- maintenance and coordination of countywide centralized eligibility lists
- subsidies for child care
- enrollment in nutrition programs
- training for child care providers
- resource materials for providers
- parenting classes for caregivers
- reporting and tracking of families and children served
- assistance to parents in finding stable employment
- enrollment in community health plans

Audience

For our 2010 conference, we are expecting around 500 attendees. Our attendees provide child care and family support services to children and families in California. Attendees are non profit CEO's, executives, subsidy child care administrators, family support workers, and child care providers, family support workers, and child care provider supports. Attendees typically work directly with families and child care providers; and are instrumental in servicing their respective local communities.

- Clearly identified objectives
